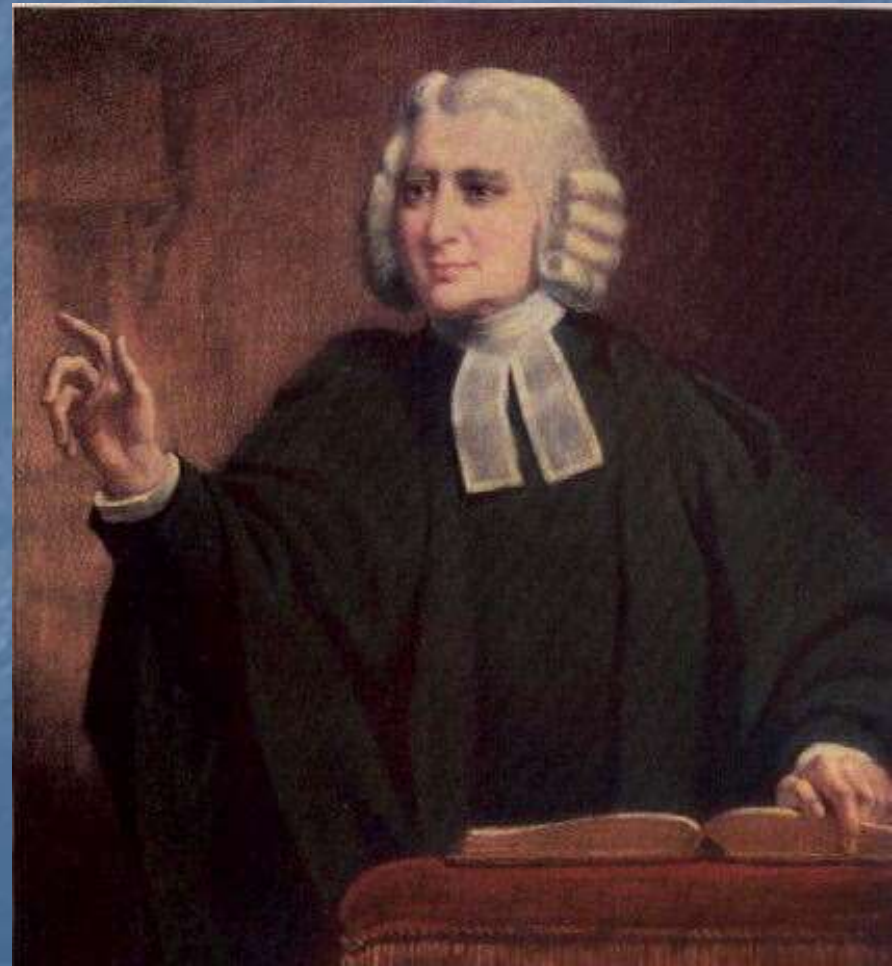


- John Wesley

- Wrote 6,000 hymns
 - "Rejoice, the Lord is King!"
 - "Jesus, Lover of My Soul"
 - "Ye Simple Souls Who Stray"
 - "Christ the Lord is Risen"
 - "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing"
 - "Come, Let Us Anew"
