




- Constantinople

  - Eastern Roman Emperor








The Byzantine Empire Under Justinian. Justinian's reconquests of North Africa, Italy, and the coast of Spain severely strained the empire's resources.


- Theodora

  - Co-ruler




- Nika Revolt

    - Reign of Justinian




- Body of Civil Law
